opened doors to big questions, meaningful learning, and future career dreams.

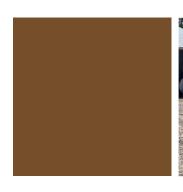

## A valued PARTNERSHIP

For **four decades**, the public and private sectors have pooled human and financial resources to advance agricultural literacy among K-12 students and educators though the Minnesota Agriculture in the Classroom (MAITC) program. This <u>unique public/private partnership</u> model provides program consistency and credibility in Minnesota's agricultural and educational communities and is known for effectively leveraging resources from both sectors.

The Minnesota Department of Agriculture is the lead for MAITC program development and implementation, while the MAITC Foundation secures and manages private funds to support the overall program. Funds committed to the program from both sectors are leveraged many times over. This partnership has also allowed MAITC to offer educational materials for FREE since program inception in 1985.

The MAITC Foundation began in 2007 to support the MAITC program. The foundation is led by a Board of Directors that represent agriculture and education communities. MAITC is a 501(c)3 not for profit charity. Funders are vital to providing free educational resources, grants and outreach to the state's K-12 community.

Minnesota was honored to host the 2025 National Agriculture in the Classroom conference and attendees from all over the country raved about the content, organization, and hospitality provided by the Minnesota team. ## National Ag in the Classroom CONFERENCE IN MINNESOTA 2025

#### A Week of Learning, Connecting & Celebrating Agriculture

In June, Minnesota hosted the <u>2025 National Agriculture in the Classroom Conference</u> in Minneapolis. Over four days, 600+ educators, volunteers, and ag literacy leaders explored ways to bring agriculture to life through workshops, tours, and shared learning.



A highlight was honoring the "25 in 2025" scholarship recipients—Minnesota teachers dedicated to advancing ag literacy. The Minnesota Reception also celebrated outgoing advisory members and thanked educators, partners, and investors.

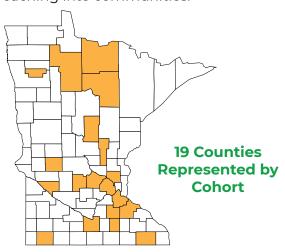
## 25 in 25 Professional Learning COHORT



Thanks to our investors' support, the <u>25 in 2025</u> <u>educators</u> attended the National Agriculture in the Classroom Conference and became a Professional Learning Cohort.

One educator who applied was especially excited about the cohort opportunity, recognizing that its impact extends beyond the conference. By joining a collaborative group, educators commit to a year of continued

learning, sharing ideas, and providing professional development in their school district. This ongoing support helps strengthen agricultural literacy, starting in the classroom and reaching into communities.



## Educator ADVISORY TEAM

The Educator Advisory Team was introduced in 2022 as a way for Minnesota Agriculture in the Classroom (MAITC) staff to stay connected and get quality feedback from Minnesota K-12 educators.

Educators completed an application and were asked to contribute time through quarterly meetings, deliver a hands-on professional development session to peers using MAITC resources, provide feedback and insight on MAITC resource development and to do this by serving a three year term. Educators are offered a stipend and reimbursement for their travel.

Their contributions have been instrumental in guiding MAITC's work and ensuring that agricultural literacy reaches classrooms in meaningful ways.

## Dutstanding TEACHER AWARD



Minnesota Agriculture in the Classroom (MAITC) is proud to honor **Nathan Lund of Glacial Hills Elementary in Starbuck** as the 2025 Outstanding Teacher of the Year.

Since 2021, Lund has inspired his 5th and 6th grade students through hands-on agricultural learning, from schoolyard gardens, hydroponics, and composting to habitat restoration and food-making projects.

His efforts, supported by programs like Ag in the Classroom, Lettuce Grow, and Farm to School, have fostered student leadership, environmental stewardship, and community engagement.

As this year's award recipient, Lund received \$500 and support to attend the 2025 National Agriculture in the Classroom Conference in Minneapolis, June 23–26, 2025.

Participants also earned CEU credits and enjoyed fun incentives such as prize drawings for an Edison robot starter pack and Outdoor Farm, Indoor Farm books, making professional development both practical and rewarding.













## Ag Literacy GRANTS

Minnesota Agriculture in the Classroom (MAITC) is a unique public/private partnership between the MAITC Foundation and the Minnesota Department of Agriculture. The Foundation has included the <u>Ag Literacy Grant program</u> in their budget. The Ag Literacy Grant Program provides awards of up to \$1,000.

These grants help K–12 educators bring agriculture and food systems to life in their classrooms by launching new ideas or enhancing existing projects. The focus is on giving students meaningful, hands-on, cross-curricular experiences with agriculture.

In the 2024–2025 school year, MAITC awarded 12 grants, reaching 3,137 students statewide in grades K-12, with \$10,431 distributed from

the **Ag Literacy Grant Fund** and **\$300** from the **Transportation Fund**.







## First-Year Teacher GRANTS

MAITC is a unique public/private partnership between the MAITC Foundation and the Minnesota Department of Agriculture. The Foundation has included the <u>First-Year Teacher Grant program</u> in their budget. The First-Year Teacher Grant Program provides **awards of up to \$200**.

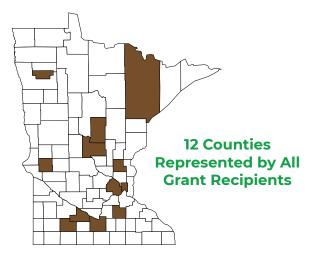
These grants support new K–12 educators in integrating agriculture into their classrooms while helping MAITC build lasting connections with teacher leaders at the start of their careers. Funding can be used for supplies, agriculture-themed resources, or hands-on learning projects that bring agriculture to life for students.

In the 2024–2025 school year, MAITC awarded 11 grants, reaching 294 students statewide in grades K-4, with \$2,030 distributed.











## School GARDEN CONFERENCE

Minnesota Agriculture in the Classroom (MAITC), the Minnesota Department of Agriculture, and the Minnesota Department of Education co-hosted the <u>School Garden Conference</u>, bringing together <u>107 educators</u>, Master Gardeners, and school leaders statewide, with 24 more on the waitlist. School gardens give students hands-on ways to meet academic goals, explore agriculture and healthy eating, engage with partners, and connect with the environment.

The conference featured 12 breakout workshops led by 17 speakers, covering practical topics such as seed starting, garden management, summer maintenance, vegetable selection, and microgreens. Seven roundtable discussions highlighted Garden to Cafeteria programs, Indigenous gardening, curriculum integration, indoor gardening, AmeriCorps support, health and wellness, and funding, while a panel on funding shared strategies to secure resources for sustainable programs.

Attendees left with lesson plans, tools, and connections, ready to grow thriving school gardens. The conference, planned in just six weeks, reinforced MAITC's commitment to helping educators create engaging, cross-curricular learning experiences that connect students to agriculture and communities.

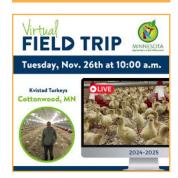
## Virtual FIELD TRIPS

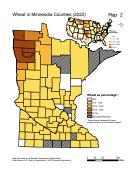


## Food For THOUGHT

Over **30,000 student desk maps** have been requested since 2020 in addition to online

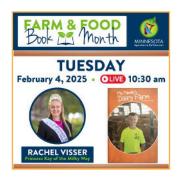
exploration of layered maps. Food for Thought is currently undergoing a revitalization process in which educators are providing feedback on how to continue to engage students with these great resources.



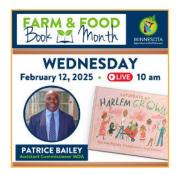
## Farm & Food BOOK MONTH

## Minnesota SPECIALTY CROPS

Minnesota is home to many specialty crop growers, from apple orchards and berry farms to Christmas tree producers and maple syrup makers. With support from the USDA Specialty Crop Block Grant, Minnesota Agriculture in the Classroom created new web pages featuring apples, berries, Christmas trees, and maple syrup.

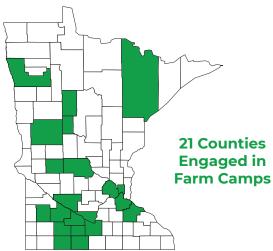
## Farm Camp MINNESOTA

#### **Transportation Grants**

<u>Transportation Grants</u> made a big impact during the 2024–2025 school year, helping **17 schools** bring students to Farm Camps.

From a group of just 5 students to one with 141, the program proved essential for schools of every size. In total, **23 buses and 4 vans** were funded through these grants. Support also extended to bussing at the 2025 National Agriculture in the Classroom Conference. A continuing challenge, however, is the limited availability of bus drivers.

#### Farm Camp Features: Metro Deaf School Visits Len Busch Roses

In October 2024, students from Metro Deaf School attended a Farm Camp at Len Busch Roses in Minneapolis. With support from a Minnesota Agriculture in the Classroom (MAITC) Transportation Grant, all students were able to participate using one bus and three vans.

They explored greenhouse technology, water systems, and flower production, sparking new interest in agriculture and even inspiring one student to apply for a summer job.

**Student understanding of agriculture grew by 35.3 percent**, with 85 percent reporting greater knowledge of the industry after the experience.

On May 1, 2025, **30 students** from Immanuel Lutheran School in Lakefield gained firsthand experience with equipment, crops, and livestock through Farm Camp Minnesota, hosted by Kurt Blomgren, State Executive Director of the Farm Service Agency, and Brandon Fast, member of the Minnesota Corn Research & Promotion Council, raising student knowledge from 65 to 100 percent.

#### Harding High School Students Connect Food, Farming, and Careers at Farm Camp

On April 24, 2025, 22 students from Harding High School visited a dairy, beef farm, and CannonBelles Cheese through Farm Camp Minnesota, where a Transportation Grant supported an experience students called their best field trip ever, boosting career awareness from 36 to 89 percent.















## The AGMAG

## 100,000 AgMags. One Incredible Milestone.



What started as a single publication in 1985 has grown into one of Minnesota's most powerful classroom resources. Each year, educators sign up annually for AgMags.

After a challenging 2020–2021 school year with just 48,000

AgMags reaching classrooms, our team pressed on with new strategies. Following a successful 2022, we set a bold goal: 100,000 requests. Thanks to the dedication of our team and Minnesota teachers, that goal became reality in 2024–2025, with distribution rising 21% over the previous year of 89,003 copies.

More than a number, this milestone reflects growing interest in agricultural literacy, teachers embracing standards-based content, and students learning where their food, fiber, and fuel come from.

The AgMag has been a cornerstone for Minnesota educators. The **FREE** series includes two gradespecific issues in print and <u>online</u> for each K–6 level, corresponding <u>teacher guides</u> and interactive activities. It complements traditional resources with close-to-home stories about producers and agriculture businesses.

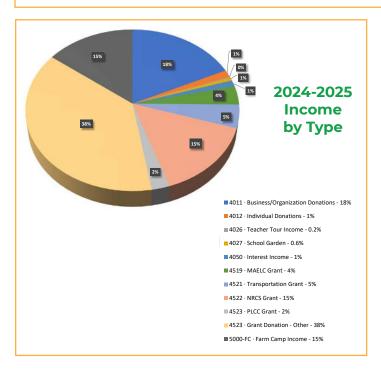

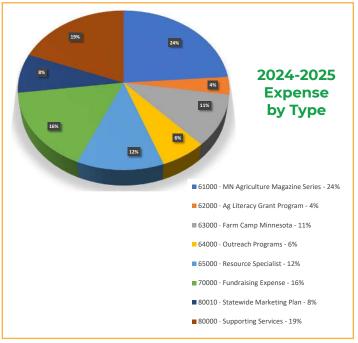
